Oxford English Dictionary Definitions

Vanity; emptiness, worthlessness; any thing or act that is futile, idle, or devoid of use; worthless and self-conceit.

Fantasy; wild, illusory notion with no counterpart in the real world. A product of the imagination.

Wishes; to have a longing for: to crave, or to desire to be at some specified place or condition.

Ambition; a going around (as in to solicit votes); demanding great effort; a drive to succeed. Eagerness.

Goals; the boundary mark, or to hinder, impede; the line or place at which a race, trip, etc. is ended. An object or end one strives to attend.

Vision; something seen other than by ordinary sight. An unusual discernment or foresight.

Belief; The conviction that something is true

Dream; to think of as possible; to realize one's ideals by first seeing and imagining them as likely.

Anger; constricted, distressed; a feeling of displeasure resulting from injury, mistreatment, opposition, etc.

Opinions; a belief not based on absolute certainty or positive knowledge but on what seems true to one's own mind.

Curiosities; unnecessarily inquisitive; prying; arousing attention or interest because a thing is unusual or strange.

Concerns; to have a relation to or bearing on; to deal with; to draw in, engage or involve.

Purpose; to propose an aim to oneself; to intend; that which one sets before himself as an object or result to be attained.

Hopes; a ground or source of happy expectation; a reason, evidence or thing on which one may base anticipation.

Principles; A law of nature or essential truth upon which other truths are based

Ideals; Thought of as perfect or as a model, exactly as one would dream; a conception of something in its most excellent form, especially something of noble design.
